Workshop	<i>Colour Theory – Kandinsky & Klimt</i>
Details	<p>Children learn about colour theory (primary and secondary colours, opposites, contrasting etc) and increase their co-ordination in painting, cutting and sticking with this fun and accessible activity.</p> <p>Part 1: On a piece of A3 card or painting paper with 6 pre-drawn squares (13.5cm), children paint different colours as neatly as they can inside the squares. Do not use the same colour twice.</p> <p>Part 2: Children use three different size circle templates to draw round onto varying colour and type of paper, card, reflective material.</p> <p>Part 3: Children cut out their circles as carefully as they can and stick them onto their dried painted squares. The result should be a beautiful “concentric circles” artwork which can all be joined together to make a fantastic display.</p> <p>Part 4: The children create a large communal work in the style of Klimt’s Tree of Life, filled in with circles, flower and bird shapes. This is a carefully planned yet varied project where small groups of children work on different sections of the artwork: one group paints the background, others cut out shapes from different types of paper and others stick and fill in the branches. Finishing touches are added with gold paint in the typical Klimt style.</p>

Materials	Provided by artist: circle stencils, gold paint, scrapbook paper, large canvas.



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	<p>Provided by school: A3 card or painting paper drawn with lines into 6 equal squares (approx 13.5cm square); paint pots of at least 8 shades of acrylic paint each with its own brush; coloured card; reflective paper; tissue paper; pencils; scissors; glue; paper clips.</p> <p>Children should have a painting shirt/apron and TAs should be on hand to assist with painting and cutting.</p>
