dot-art Schools annual inter-school art competition celebrates and showcases visual arts from schools across Liverpool City Region. Join dot-art Schools to nurture talent, raise ambition and develop pupils' confidence.



ABOUT

dot-art Schools is an interactive, online, inter-school art competition, taking place annually and culminating in a public exhibition of the winning artworks and prize giving celebration for teachers, students and their families.

The competition is open to all Primary (Year 5) and Secondary (Year 9) and SEND schools in the six boroughs of Liverpool City Region and beyond. It is designed to nurture talent, raise aspiration and take art out of the classroom into the real world.

Set up in 2012 in response to demand from local schools and the sidelining of the arts in the curriculum, to date over 11,500 children and young people have taken part.

WHY?

The positive impact of our programme on students' mental health and well-being has been proven. Research carried out by Liverpool Hope University and Curious Minds showed that taking part in dotart Schools nurtures children and young peoples' creativity and boosts their confidence. We learnt that the students gain a measurable sense of self-respect from the process. Participating in the competition can also raise aspirations and engage student's families. We know that the pandemic has increased the disadvantage gap markedly; engaging with dot-art Schools helps build valuable cultural capital in students

- Increase pupils' self-esteem, particularly important with the growing mental health crisis facing young people, which has been magnified during lockdown.

WHEN?

Sept to Dec	Schools sign up to participate in dot-art Schools.
February	Schools submit photographs of students' artworks by half term. Competition entries are added to the school's portfolio page on the dot-art Schools website.
March	Judging panel of respected arts professionals shortlist the top $3\ \mathrm{entries}$ from each school
April	The public vote online for their favourite shortlisted entry. The entry with most votes from each school wins a place in the exhibition.
May	Schools frame their winning entry ready for dot-art to transport it to and from the exhibition.
June	Guest judge selects the overall winners and runners up at the exhibition and announces them at the prize giving ceremony.

- A dedicated portfolio page on the dot-art Schools website, featuring students artwork entries, brief info and a link to your schools website
- Promotion via printed publicity & social media
- Your winning entry collected from and returned to school
- Your school's winner exhibited in a high quality public exhibition
- Invitations for shortlisted students, their families and staff to attend prize-giving ceremony
- A certificate for each shortlisted student and the school
