



Entry Photo Tips

The photographs of the student's artwork that you submit will feature on your schools' webpage on our website, which is used for judging, so it's important to take decent photos of their artwork. Here are a few tips for taking photos of the students' entries. If students send you their own photos of artwork do make sure they are edited as well as possible before submitting.

- **Tip 1.** If you aren't confident with taking and editing photos ask a colleague for help!
- **Tip 2.** Photos need to be in focus - lean your phone or camera on a hard surface or use a tripod to keep it steady.
- **Tip 3.** Take the photos in daylight, avoid making shadows and crop to the edge of the image - no background distractions please!
- **Tip 4.** Avoid including any names, stickers, or teachers comments in the image.
- **Tip 5.** Avoid taking images with the sides on a slant. Put the work on the wall and stand directly opposite to photograph it.
- **Tip 6.** Each entry needs a different file name to distinguish it from your other entries e.g. Pop-art-1, pop-art-2.
- **Tip 7.** The maximum size of entry photo files is 2 megabytes per image file. Here is a link to a free, easy online file re-sizer <https://bulkresizephotos.com/>

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
