#### **ABOUT**

dot-art Schools is an interactive, online, inter-school art competition, taking place annually and culminating in a public exhibition of the winning artworks and prize giving celebration for teachers, students and their families

The competition is open to all Primary (Year 5) and Secondary (Year 9) and SEND schools in the six boroughs of Liverpool City Region and beyond. It is designed to nurture talent, raise aspiration and take art out of the classroom into the real world.

Set up in 2012 in response to demand from local schools and the sidelining of the arts in the curriculum, to date over 14,500 children and young people have taken part.

| Sept to Dec | Schools sign up to participate in dot-art Schools.  |
|-------------|---|
| February    | Schools submit photographs of students' artworks by half term. Competition entries are added to the school's portfolio page on the dot-art Schools website. |
| March       | Judging panel of respected arts professionals shortlist the top 3 entries from each school  |
| April       | The public vote online for their favourite shortlisted entry. The entry with most votes from each school wins a place in the exhibition.                    |
| May         | Schools frame their winning entry ready for dot-art to transport it to and from the exhibition.   |
| June        | Guest judge selects the overall winners and runners up at the exhibition and announces them at the prize giving ceremony.                                   |
